This innovative, large scale, collaborative quality improvement project implemented and evaluated the impact of facilitated introduction of fever, hyperglycaemia and swallowing protocols in all 36 NSW stroke services within a fast-paced 14-month time frame. This project demonstrated how strategic collaborations between industry, academia and professional bodies can work together to translate research into the real world of clinical practice. Other completed key projects involving SV&MHS and reflecting their clinical priorities included investigation of clinician views of innovative strategies to improve hand hygiene compliance, and patient views of their role in pressure injury prevention.

Overall, we are honoured to present the projects and outputs of the NRI for 2013 which reflects our ongoing dedication to research excellence and to the dissemination and translation of this work to inform policy and practice. Again we would like to acknowledge the ongoing commitment from SV&MHS and the ACU and their continuing support of the NRI's efforts to achieve our vision for improving patient outcome and care.
